For most children, processing what they see, hear, and feel is automatic and does not disrupt their thoughts or behavior. But for some children, this process of combining information from the various senses (sight, touch, and hearing), creates problems. Sensory integration difficulties are often associated with poor social interaction, self-regulation, self-esteem, and attention, leading some to believe that these sensory difficulties underlie developmental and attention disorders such as Autism and ADHD.

Come to the workshop to learn more about the City College Children's Research Unit study which hopes to further understand the causes of developmental, sensory, and attention disorders, leading to better therapies to improve the lives of those affected by such disorders.
